SCHOOL ON WHEEL PROJECT:

The school on wheels is the flagship project of Door Step School is running successfully. The Van designed as a mobile class room. It is a strategy to reach out to the most unreached groups of out-of-school children i.e. street children, pavement dwellers and dalit and tribal community children. The primary



objective of Door Step School's non formal education classes is to provide an opportunity of education for out of school children from pavement communities Door Step School acts as a liaison to prepare the child for an appropriate level and facilitate admission in school in the following academic year. Door Step School became a reality with the start of non formal education a class for 120 out of school teenagers in four villages in past six months, study classes and libraries also being initiated and 12 children are enrolled in formal school.

EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN:



The trust provides financial assistance for poor children for their education. It also provided direct help by providing notebooks and texts books to the students and help them by providing school uniform. The children were selected by the committee members and recommended by the local village people. Last year 86 children have



been benefited from this scheme and it will also provide the economic support for the parents.

SELF EMPLOYMENT TRAINING:

This year 60 women and girls were benefited through this project and the organization has issued the certificate. This Certification will help them to get employment in public and private



sectors or start their own business. The women to benefit from this program are currently living below the poverty line. This project offers the possibility of self-employment to 30 women in poor families improves and enhances the earning and living conditions of the target group, remove them from a situation of poverty, hunger, disease and premature death and contributes to their economic independence. This project particularly targets economically women headed households. Women's economic development focuses on enhancing the opportunity for women to generate and to increase their income and to improve their standard of living.

TRIBAL PEOPLE SUPPORT: (Goat Rearing)



One of the objectives of the trust is to help the Tribal people welfare. The trust identifies such women and aged people who are suffering in life due to death of their husband and struggling for food, security and shelter the trust help them. This is done through recommendations from various



people who are in touch with the trustees of the trust. The trust provided to financial assistance to these widows and aged people on regular basis. We help them to generate their income through goat rearing.

FREE TUTION CENTER:

EMT conducts free tuition centres for Tribal and Dalit children backward and economically weaker sections at Nallavur village in Villupuram district with the help of The Sunflower Foundation, Australia. The teachers at these tuition centres develop personal



rapport with the students by spending quality time with them. This helps the teachers to understand the students' weaknesses and requirements well, and make them improve in their studies. The teachers also strive to make school dropouts continue their studies. The main purpose of this project is to make the less privileged children competent enough to compete with the privileged ones in education. We concentrate on the academic excellence. We also give due consideration to extend our tuition centres as centres of holistic human development, to bring out the hidden talents and potentialities of the underprivileged children. We offer free tuition up to 10th standard for subjects like English, Maths and Science. We give not only free tuition facilities but also assist the poor children with free supply of study materials such as note-books, text books, uniforms, pen etc. They are offered regular incentives so as to make the whole process of studying a pleasant task. Thus our tuition centres have new and creative orientations taking into consideration the overall growth of the child.

ELSHADDAI HOSPITAL:

EMT believes that the concurrent development of preventive and promotive health is crucial to the well being of those who are unable to afford regular health care. With this in mind EMT plays a crucial role in providing health care facilities, developing health seeking



behaviour and strengthening the existing health delivering mechanisms amongst the target communities.

EMT through its community health programme has been able to proceed access to health services to 145000 persons by medical service.

WATER AND SANITATION:

Seethapuram Village



Elshaddai Ministries Trust has provided Bore well with solar pump and Toilet blocks in Seethapuram village of Kancheepuram District. The provision of water and sanitation project for Dalit and Tribal Community is a project EMT, India working in partnership with JAD, UK .The

outcome of water supply and sanitation in rural areas is the area became Open defecation free project area, Availability of adequate drinking water, Behavioral change for reduction in disease, poverty and suffering and Empowered community.
